School candidates to speak at event

Voters will have a chance to hear candidates for the Rochester Board of Education present their plans for the district at a community forum on Wednesday.

The forum is being sponsored by graduates of the Greater Rochester Parent Leadership Training Institute and the League of Women Voters. It will be from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the Downtown United Presbyterian Church, 121 N. Fitzhugh St.

The confirmed candidates are José Cruz, Ron Hall, Candice Lucas, Lori Thomas and Van White, according to a news release from planners.

The forum will begin with remarks by professors from the Warner School at the University of Rochester, as well as former school board member Robert Brown.

Audience members will be able to submit questions.

Online map provides city data

An interactive, online data map of Rochester city neighborhoods allows people to view, aggregate and analyze more than 50 economic and social-condition indicators from crime rates to vacant structures, homeownership, children not in school, grant applications and more.

The Neighborhood Data Map divides the city into its 229 Census designated block groups. In a statement, Mayor Thomas Richards explains: "The map data provides points of reference that can be used to measure progress in real time, allowing for the ability to make adjustments and maximize the effectiveness of scarce re-

sources."

The map can be found at cityofrochester.gov/neighborhooddatamap. A link to a user guide is included on the web page. For now, the city data is from 2012, while census data dates from 2010. New data will be added in February and figures reflecting changes over time will be available starting sometime next year.

Man charged with beating woman

A Rochester man accused of beating a woman in the face with a metal pipe Sunday and stealing her cash had been arraigned in City Court.

Glenn T. Enderlin, 44, on Tuesday morning pleaded not guilty to first-degree robbery, second-degree assault and fourth-degree grand larceny, all felonies.

According to court documents, Enderlin is accused of hitting a 24-year-old city woman in the face several times using a foot-long metal pipe inside his Myrtle Street home. He's also accused of hitting her with his fists and taking \$30 cash from her, according to court records.

In her statement to police, the woman said she knew Enderlin for more than a year and went to his home Saturday night willingly. After the attack, which occurred about 8 a.m. Sunday, she told police she ran from the house and sought help at a corner store on Lyell Avenue.

She was taken to Strong Memorial Hospital for treatment. The woman's medical status was not available.

Enderlin was remanded to the Monroe County Jail in lieu of \$20,000 cash bail and is scheduled to return to City Court Friday morning.
