October Forum: Voting in Monroe County 2016

Every week, the League receives questions about the rules for voting in Monroe County. Since every state sets its own rules and regulations (except for voting age), it can be confusing with national media reporting on so many different circumstances.


We hear about voter fraud and extreme measures to protect against it – and we also hear that it's actually not a problem at all. We hear about LWVUS participating in lawsuits in states where access to voting is being reduced, and we advocate for increased access in our own state. League members can see that the rules are complex and we take great care when registering voters to explain – or refer potential voters to the Board of Elections phone number (585-753-1550) or website (http://www2. monroecounty.gov/elections-index.php).

Some important questions are:

- What security measures does Monroe County take to protect voters and their votes?
- What issues do we have using the current paper ballots?
- What do voters need to know before Election Day?
- What election reforms are we seeing across the country and will we see any of them in New York State?

We've invited our Monroe County Board of Elections Commissioners Thomas Ferrarese and David Van Varick to answer these and other questions about voting in 2016.

We in Monroe County are most fortunate that our Board of Elections is committed to listening to and serving local voters. So bring your questions! Invite your friends! Come to the First Unitarian Church, 220 Winton Road South, at 7:00 P.M. on Wednesday, October 26.

Voter Services

October 14, the final date for registering for the General Election, is drawing near, so our voter service volunteers were kept incredibly busy.

Overall we registered voters at 27 locations during this past month, working with our community partners—Rochester Voter Alliance, the American Red Cross, FingerLakes Donor Recovery, and The Susan B. Anthony Museum and House. We continued our work with the Anthony Jordan Health System, joined with Project Homeless Connect, and expanded our outreach to area college students participating in orientation sessions at Nazareth, the Eastman School of Music, the University of Rochester, Rochester Institute of Technology, Monroe Community College, The College at Brockport, and SUNY Geneseo. We assisted a Burmese population at Lake Avenue Baptist Church, worked at a TIPS program at the Carter Street Recreation Center, and provided registration services at Mayor Warren's Annual Commemorative at the Keller Park Apartments.

In addition to our registration activities, Barb Grosh made presentations on voting to advocacy groups at Monroe Developmental and Lifetime Assistance while Georgia DeGregorio and Hasana Martin spoke with a seniors group at the Maplewood YMCA. We also took on the role of Election Inspectors for the AFSCME Local 1635 Election of Officers and Board Members.

The Legislators witnessed a demonstration by County CSEA workers, many of whom carried picket signs into the legislative chambers. President Daniele allowed the signs to stay providing participants were respectful of people in the gathering.

Bess Watts addressed the Legislature, questioning why Harris Beach is paid expensive fees when the County has attorneys already in its employ.

The operating budget for Monroe Community College was passed with dissenting votes from Cynthia Kaleh and John Lightfoot.

A contract with Greater Rochester Enterprise, Inc, was authorized for general operating expenses.

Eight individuals were appointed or reappointed to the Monroe County Recycling Advisory Committee. The names of those appointed may be found on the County website under "government" "referrals, resolutions and local laws"


